OUR PUBLICATIONS



COLLECTED ESSAYS ON LEARNING AND TEACHING (CELT)

CELT's 15th volume was published on March 28th, 2024. The most recent edition features peer-reviewed papers originally presented at the 40th face-to-face STLHE Conference Reconnecting and Reconstructing: Perspectives on Teaching and Learning that took place on the unceded traditional territory of the Algonquin Anishinaabeg People from June 7-10, 2022. This issue was long awaited by the 26 brilliant and patient authors that collectively comprised this edition titled A Renewed Commitment: Enhancing Opportunities for Scholars of Teaching and Learning. Seven original papers were published on topics such as taking stock of the 2022 STLHE conference, failure and learning, educational leadership and authentic teaching, sense of belonging, decolonizing higher education, teaching "soft" skills, and aligning course outcomes through appropriate evaluation assessments. *CELT* is looking forward to continuing engagement with the STLHE community with the publication of Volume 16 in fall 2024.

CANADIAN JOURNAL FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP OF TEACHING AND LEARNING (CJSOTL)

This year, 2023, has been an exciting one for the Journal. Persistent efforts by the Editorial Team over the year have resulted in significant improvements in our manuscript processing timelines. With renewed support from our reviewers in 2023, the average manuscript was accepted for publication 4 months faster than our target timeline. In most cases, manuscripts now receive an initial desk review within two weeks of submission.

While the number of submissions received in 2023 dipped lower than the previous year, the number of quality submissions moving into our peer review processes remains high. We published two issues representing 34 articles, exceeding both our projections and our pre-pandemic baseline. Based on trends in the latter half of the year, we are anticipating that next year will yield three similarly large issues. This high level of interest in publishing with *CJSoTL* is exciting and reflects the continued growth of the SoTL community in Canada.

Thank you to all members of the Editorial Team, Editorial Board, reviewers, and authors for their contributions. As a volunteer-driven scholarly publication venue, the success of *CJSoTL* reflects the good health of our community.

2023 STLHE CONFERENCE – CHARLOTTETOWN, PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND


